APP EMPOWERS CONSUMERS TO DRIVE EMPLOYER COMPLIANCE

U.S. LABOR DEPARTMENT DATA NOW JUST A TAP AWAY

Given the choice, would you dine at a restaurant or shop at a store that didn't pay its employees properly? Stay at a hotel that exposed workers to hazardous working conditions?

Now, thanks to a new mobile application sponsored by the U.S. Department of Labor, smart consumers can factor an employer's track record of employee treatment and workplace safety into their buying decisions.

Enforcement data is now literally in the hands of consumers.

"Eat Shop Sleep" combines enforcement data from the Department's Wage and Hour Division and Occupational Safety and Health Administration with consumer ratings web sites like Yelp and other tools, like Google Maps.

- restaurants
- hotels
- retail establishments



When using "Eat Shop Sleep" search to make sure the restaurant or hotel you're planning to visit has received positive reviews, you can also make sure that they have not been found in violation of federal workplace safety, child labor, and wage payment laws.

Use it while job hunting:

Thanks to "Eat Shop Sleep," a prospective employer's history with the Department of Labor can now be reviewed with the tap of the screen.

The mobile app was the first-place winner of the Department's "InformAction Challenge," DOL's first-ever contest to spur the software developer community to create smartphone or computer applications that would be useful to the public.

The "iCitizen Labor Report" app, available on iTunes, finished in second place; with "I.C. InfoChoice," a web-based application finishing third.
